Subject: APHIS Removes West Indian Fruit Fly (*Anastrepha obliqua*) Quarantine in Hidalgo County, Texas

To: State, Tribal, and Territory Agricultural Regulatory Officials

On June 9, 2026, U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), in cooperation with the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA), removed the West Indian fruit fly (*Anastrepha obliqua*) quarantine in Hidalgo County, designated the Palmview quarantine. This action released 68.2 square miles from quarantine, including 495.7 acres of commercial citrus.

APHIS originally restricted the interstate movement of regulated articles from this area to prevent the spread of West Indian fruit fly to non-infested areas of the United States. APHIS and TDA have now successfully eradicated this transient West Indian fruit fly population using approved program control methods.
