I, the undersigned official veterinarian duly authorized by the Government of Canada, after due inquiry and to the best of my knowledge, do hereby certify that the following requirements are met:

1. Canada is free of African swine fever (ASF), classical swine fever (CSF), foot-and-mouth disease (FMD), swine vesicular disease (SVD), and swine pseudorabies (Aujeszky's disease, AD).

OR

In the event of an outbreak of foreign animal disease, the swine covered by this health certificate did not originate from or transit through a current United States Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Services (USDA APHIS) recognized zone or region established due to the detection of ASF, CSF, FMD, SVD, or AD in captive swine^a. The swine had no contact with any swine or swine products (including imported swine or products) that were located in a current USDA APHIS recognized zone or region established due to the detection of ASF, CSF, FMD, SVD, or AD in captive swine.

OR

In the event of an ASF outbreak in non-captive swine^b, the swine covered by this health certificate did not originate from a current USDA APHIS recognized area of control^c or assurance area^d established due to the detection of ASF in non-captive swine, or transit through an area of control. The swine had no contact with any swine or swine products (including imported swine or products) that were located in a current USDA APHIS recognized area of control or assurance area established due to the detection of ASF in non-captive swine.

2. The swine to be exported are not vaccinated against ASF, CSF, FMD, SVD, or AD and are not progeny of vaccinated sows.
3. During the thirty (30) days immediately preceding their dispatch the swine intended for export to the United States have been isolated in such a way as to preclude any contact with other swine or ruminants not of equal health status.
4. The swine to be exported were not previously imported into Canada from countries designated by the USDA as affected with FMD, ASF, CSF, or SVD.
5. The swine to be exported have been in Canada for a minimum of sixty (60) days immediately preceding the date of export to the United States.
6. The attesting CFIA-accredited veterinarian has inspected the swine on the premises of origin within fourteen (14) days of the date of export and found the swine to be free of evidence of infectious and communicable disease. In the event of an outbreak of a foreign animal disease listed under article 1 above, the swine must be inspected within seven (7) days prior to export.

7. The swine were not vaccinated with a live, an attenuated or an inactivated vaccine during the fourteen (14) days preceding export to the United States.
8. Prior to export, all swine were individually identified by unique identification (plastic bangle tag that can be read without restraining the pigs or an equivalent) and a second permanent identification in the form of a plastic or metal ear tag, unique tattoo, brand or microchip.
9. The swine to be exported were tested negative for brucellosis using the fluorescence polarization assay (FPA), or other test approved by the USDA APHIS, within thirty (30) days of export to the United States.

NOTES:
a. Captive swine: any swine species that does not meet the definition of non-captive swine.
b. Non-captive swine: any swine species that is not kept in a captive environment; free-roaming swine; equivalent to feral swine as defined by USDA APHIS and wild pigs as defined by CFIA.
c. Area of Control: a central infected zone surrounded by one or more additional zones; equivalent to control area as defined by USDA APHIS and primary control zone as defined by CFIA.
d. Assurance Area: restricted area extending beyond the perimeter of the Area of Control (AOC) to provide additional security against spread of the ASF virus through international trade while the affected country fully establishes the AOC.
