I hereby certify to the best of my ability from the information that has been provided to me that:

1.
 - a) The animals have resided in Canada or the United States from birth or were legally imported into Canada from another region and have been free of any import quarantine or health related restrictions and able to move freely within Canada's national herd for a minimum of sixty (60) days prior to export.
 - b) If the camelidae are offspring of animals legally imported into Canada from another region, they have been free of any import quarantine or health related restrictions and able to move freely within Canada's national herd for a minimum of sixty (60) days prior to export.
2. All animals are at least six (6) months of age and fully weaned prior to export, unless travelling at the foot of their dam. Animals less than six (6) months of age and travelling at the foot of their dam are identified on this health certificate and meet the required health status but were not tested for tuberculosis or brucellosis.
3. All animals are permanently and individually identified.
4. The animals have been resident of the herd of origin in Canada for a minimum period of sixty (60) days prior to export and do not originate from premises containing ruminant or swine species that are not part of a herd recognized by CFIA to be free of tuberculosis and brucellosis.
5. *Mycobacterium bovis*, *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* and *Brucella abortus* have not been diagnosed clinically, by diagnostic test, or by post mortem examination in a camelid, ruminant and/or swine on the premises of origin within the three (3) years preceding the issuance of the export health certificate.
6. The animals were isolated for at least 60 days prior to export and during this time, they were tested for the following diseases with negative results:
 - 6.1 Bovine tuberculosis (*Mycobacterium bovis*) - within sixty (60) days of export, each animal was tested with negative results using an intradermal tuberculin test with CFIA approved methodology.
 - 6.2 Bovine brucellosis (*Brucella abortus*) - within thirty (30) days preceding the date of export, each animal was tested with negative results using a test prescribed by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE).

Note: If the animals destined to export have not been isolated for at least 60 days, all ruminants or swine that were commingling with them have been tested at the same time and for the same diseases as described in this section.
7. Upon inspection within 30 days prior to departure for export to the United States, the camelidae showed no clinical signs of communicable disease.
8. Animals being exported to the United States will be transported in cleaned and disinfected trucks directly from the premises of origin (or the isolation facility) to the U.S. port of entry.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS (do not join this page to the certificate)

Deaths during pre-export:

Any camelid over the age of six (6) months that dies within the 60 days pre-export/isolation period must be subjected to a post-mortem examination supervised by the CFIA. In cases where the cause of death is not conclusively confirmed, appropriate lymph nodes and any suspected lesions found on other organs/tissues must be submitted to a CFIA laboratory for histological examination and culture for *Mycobacteria spp* or other suspected diseases.

Inspection at the port of entry:

- a) Domestic camelidae must be presented at the U.S. port of entry by appointment. Confirmation should be provided to the VS port veterinarian 72 hours prior to arrival.
- b) All domestic camelidae will be offloaded for inspection.
