This is to certify that the Specified Pathogen Free (SPF) eggs described herein conform to the current veterinary import requirements of the United States. Health certificates are valid for 30 days from the date of issue by the examining veterinarian of the exporting country.

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The official veterinarian certifies for export that the flock of origin for the hatching eggs covered under this health certificate were inspected by the examining veterinarian issuing the health certificate and:

1. The flock of origin for the hatching eggs was not vaccinated against any H5 or H7 subtype of avian influenza.
2. The flock of origin for the hatching eggs:
 - ☐ Was not vaccinated against Newcastle disease (avian paramyxovirus), OR
 - ☐ Was vaccinated against Newcastle disease at least 21 days prior to export using vaccines that do not contain any velogenic strains of Newcastle disease virus.

3. The flock of origin for the hatching eggs presented no evidence of avian communicable disease within the 30 days prior to the hatching of the first egg laid for this shipment.
4. The hatching eggs were exported from an area that was not under quarantine during the 90 days preceding the exportation.
5. The flock or the flock of origin is not vaccinated and is certified Specified Pathogen Free (SPF) in accordance with European Pharmacopoeia 5.2.2, *Chicken Flocks Free from Specified Pathogens for the Production and Quality Control of Vaccines* and equivalent USDA Veterinary Services Memorandum No. 800.65, *Eggs and Chickens for Production of Veterinary Biological Products*. The flock of origin is negative for Avian metapneumovirus (also known as Turkey Rhinotracheitis, (TRT), or Swollen Head Syndrome) and Egg Drop Syndrome (EDS 76).
6. The flock of origin tested negative for Salmonella enteritidis (SE) within 30 days by environmental culture and there is no evidence or knowledge of SE present in the flock.
7. For Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) and Newcastle Disease: EITHER
 - a. The hatching eggs of poultry did not originate from, nor transit through, any zone within the EPTR that was restricted for outbreaks of Newcastle disease or HPAI in commercial poultry for the following period of time, whichever is later:
 - i. Until the restrictions were lifted by the national competent authority; or
 - ii. 90 days after depopulation of all affected premises, followed by cleaning and disinfection of the last affected premises, in that zone. Shipments must arrive with seals approved by the competent authority and corresponding numbers listed on the import health certificate.

OR,
 - b. The hatching eggs of poultry did not originate from any zone within the EPTR that was restricted for outbreaks of Newcastle disease or HPAI but did travel under official seal through zones that were restricted for outbreaks of Newcastle disease or HPAI in commercial poultry for the following period of time, whichever is later:
 - i. Until the restrictions were lifted by the national competent authority; or
 - ii. 90 days after depopulation of all affected premises, followed by cleaning and disinfection of the last affected premises, in that zone. Shipments must arrive with seals approved by the competent authority and corresponding numbers listed on the import health certificate.

Note: In this option, the seal numbers must be noted in the health certificate signed by the certifying veterinarian, with an official veterinarian verifying the seals for such shipments were intact at the time of embarkation.
11. The hatching eggs were not commingled with hatching eggs of lesser health status than species on this certificate.
12. The hatching eggs were placed in new or appropriately sanitized packaging for shipment to the United States at the premises where the flock or origin was kept.

*****Certificate shall be valid for 30 days from date of issue*****

The official veterinarian must endorse the examining veterinarian's signature OR the official veterinarian's signature, and government seal may be used alone if the official veterinarian conducted the inspection.
