USDA Authorization for Response and Associated Activities

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This document provides guidance on USDA authorization for response and associated activities for initial (index case) and subsequent detections of New World screwworm (NWS) myiasis in domestic animals or wildlife, or detections of the NWS wild fly, within a State or Territory. GENERAL GUIDANCE

The first (index) case of NWS (in an animal or a fly detection) in any State or Territory will need USDA National Veterinary Services Laboratories (NVSL) confirmation for USDA authorization of response and associated activities, including any potential indemnity or compensation .

For additional or subsequent NWS cases in a State or Territory, when the criteria for an [NWS presumptive positive case](#) in an animal is met or the NWS wild fly is detected, **AND** the identification is performed at an APHIS approved laboratory or by an entomologist that has met proficiency testing requirements for NWS, USDA will authorize response and associated activities. Any NWS identification by a laboratory or entomologist that is not USDA approved is considered a suspect case.

All National Animal Health Laboratory Network or APHIS approved laboratory results will be subsequently confirmed by NVSL.

The USDA APHIS Administrator or Veterinary Services (VS) Deputy Administrator (Chief Veterinary Officer [CVO] of the United States) can authorize APHIS personnel—in conjunction with State, Tribal, and unified Incident Command personnel—to initiate NWS response procedures.
